Explanation: Use “Her” as the pronoun is the object of the preposition “to.”
4. She and I went to the movies last night.
Explanation: Use “She” as the pronoun is the subject of the sentence (performing the action).
5. I saw her at the coffee shop earlier.
Explanation: Use “Her” when the pronoun is the object of the verb “saw.”
6. The teacher praised her for the excellent presentation.
Explanation: Use “Her” as the pronoun is the object of the verb “praised.”
7. Can you pass the message to her?
Explanation: Use “Her” as the pronoun is the object of the preposition “to.”
8. She and her friends are planning a road trip.
Explanation: Use “She” as the pronoun is the subject of the sentence (performing the action).
9. I'm going shopping with her this afternoon.
Explanation: Use “Her” as the pronoun is the object of the preposition “with.”
